Sir Arthur Conan Doyle's 1886 novella *A Study in Scarlet*, first published in 1887, introduced his character Sherlock Holmes. Although Conan Doyle wrote 56 short stories featuring Holmes, *A Study in Scarlet* is one of only four full-length novels in the original canon. The novel was followed by *The Sign of the Four*, published in 1890.

The Adventure of The Dancing Men by Sir Arthur Conan Doyle (First published in *Collier's Weekly* and the *Strand Magazine*, December 1903) HOLMES had been seated for some hours in silence with his long, thin back curved over a chemical vessel in which he was brewing a particularly malodorous product.
